Rural-urban polarization has received much attention in the United States and elsewhere, but what does it mean, and is it a problem in Canada? How can we study rural-urban polarization and its consequences without further contributing to the polarization? And do co-ops have a unique role to play in maintaining social cohesion between rural and urban folks and their communities?

In this Co-op Conversation, Dr. Dionne Pohler shares some early insights from her ongoing ethnographic research in rural Canadian communities as well as future research on ruralurban polarization in collaboration with colleagues from the Canadian Centre for the Study of Co-operatives, the Alberta Centre for Sustainable Rural Communities, and the Canadian Centre for Rural and Agricultural Health.
